- VII. Guest Speaker Kathy Luongo, College and Career Specialist
 - A. Speaking about Summer opportunities; Important to understand your student's needs, they may need a break and downtime; others may be ready to jump in and work a lot to make money or be involved in something outside of school, others may need to be doing Summer learning, SAT/prep or getting ready to apply to college or visit college campuses; Something else to think about -Summer reading! Something that gets less focus in high school but still super important (Ms. Luongo has opportunites list with ideas of things you can do throughout high school - things that can help organize their time for upcoming things for the next year; Job Fairs/resume workshops (there is one for Teens too in March, and at SLHS on April 5th for Summer jobs; Enrichment programs which can supplement areas of interest or career path, if on a college campus can help them get a feel for being on campus and more independent; all of these things can help with college applications as they help students explore and deepen awareness in areas of interest; going to a program on a campus is NOT a guarantee to admission to that institution, it is also not

- required to show interest in a school but can be a great opportunity if it fits your needs;
- B. Discussion on College Admissions process shared results of survey of what students thought was important to colleges for admissions, then compared to what colleges actually consider. Students thought test scores were higher in importance, however the reality is most colleges care more about your extracurriculars and showing who you are and what you're interested in than test scores; they want students to be balanced and to show who they are as an individual; discussion of standardized testing and its importance (or lack thereof) in applications all schools are different so be sure you know what's required for the schools you're interested in
- C. Things parents can do encourage kids to use Naviance, visit career center and review weekly emails, register for college rep visits, look into scholarships (understand if scholarships are "stackable" or "displaced")
- D. Discussion around curriculum, IB, AP, CP, etc as parents are negotiating course planning right now

VIII. Principal's Report - Kim Retzer, Principal

A. Superintendent coming out with proposed budget soon - no updates yet on what is included; updates on recent events in the school - science fair, Snowball Dance, Ethics Day, sporting events, Theater/Chorus, DECA/FBLA, upcoming recognition events for MLK Day and Black History; Tardies & attendance concerns are at an all-time high - hard to keep up with, staff-intensive to monitor; both excused and unexcused absences count against us!! Reviewed ways for parents to know what their students status is; summaries will go out to parents via email; working on way to incentivize kids to be in school; Parent Project initiative run by parent liaisons - classes to educate families on how to navigate public school system, some in other languages to serve broadest audience as possible - serves families with 5th-12th grade.
