Spoke to us about the initiatives being undertaken by FCPS to support students mental health. Student Survey tracks trends over past year. Mental health trends are getting better, lower rates of depression/stress/suicidal thoughts. Substance abuse is at an all-time low (since 2010) and lower in FCPS than national average. Spoke about "protective factors" and their correlation to lower rates of crisis and substand abuse including School, Community, Family & Individual. Reviewed all the support resources available in FCPS including school-based, tele-health, other community resources (some are self-serve and school counselors/social workers can help connect students in need to some others).
